Dear Friends and Family,

We are mostly ok and happy, but this has been a year of medical issues. In February Dan tripped on uneven pavement in Coolidge Corner, hitting his head on some curbing surrounding a tree. After some six hours in the Beth Israel emergency room and fifteen stitches later we finally returned home to a late supper. Apparently some nerve damage resulted in neck pain and scalp itch -- annoying but bearable.

In May, Betts suffered a stroke affecting the language area of her brain. A quick trip to the the Beth Israel emergency room minimized the damage, but she was weeks in the hospital, more weeks in Spaulding Rehab, back to the hospital for meds adjustments, and then home with multiple visits from visiting nurses and speech therapists -- now done.
